



RINKER ROCK CREEK RANCH

A sustainable rangeland research and education facility in the heart of Idaho where ranching, recreation and conservation intersect.



THE RANCH

Rinker Rock Creek Ranch is located in the Wood River Valley of central Idaho. The ranch encompasses about 20,000 acres in the Rock Creek watershed, including 10,400 acres of deeded meadows and rangeland surrounded by Bureau of Land Management and state grazing allotments. The property has supported ranching families who have lived and worked on Idaho's rangelands for over a hundred years. It is home to an abundance of wildlife such as: greater sage-grouse, pygmy rabbits, song birds, golden eagles and other raptors, pronghorn, badger, beaver, elk and moose.



THE VISION

In 2014, Harry and Diane Rinker sold Rock Creek Ranch to the Wood River Land Trust (WRLT) and The Nature Conservancy (TNC) at a generous price to support conservation. WRLT and TNC worked with the Natural Resources Conservation Service to secure long-term protections of the ranch's grasslands and wildlife habitat.



The University of Idaho later joined as a third partner to expand research, education, and public outreach. In 2019, U of I acquired Rinker Rock Creek Ranch. It is jointly managed by the College of Natural Resources, the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences, and reports to an advisory committee that ensures a collaborative approach to landscape-scale conservation and sustainable ranching practices.

THE FUTURE

While providing for public access, the ranch also serves as an outdoor laboratory. Discoveries made here will help land managers make informed decisions in addressing the significant challenges facing Western rangelands.

The ranch is host to riparian and stream restoration projects, water quality enhancements, grazing cattle, vegetation and fire studies and outdoor education programs. Students also have the opportunity to gain professional development on site through seasonal internships.
