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### **SPRING SEMESTER MIDTERM GRADES**

If you are teaching **Spring Semester courses**, the window to enter optional midterm grades opens **April 7**! You will have through **April 11** to enter midterm grades in **MyUI** for Spring courses. See the **Faculty Grade Entry Detailed Instructional Guide** here. Please ensure that your rosters are accurate and contain only registered students who are participating in your class. Any students listed on your roster not participating in your course must submit a withdraw request (see below).

Final grades for yearlong courses will be entered at the end of the Spring Semester.

# **Withdrawal Process for Spring Semester**

The withdrawal deadline for Spring Semester courses is **April 25, 2025**. Typically, students must request a withdraw on the *Status* page in their **DualEnroll** account and have the request approved by their high school counselor prior to the April 25 deadline. Unfortunately, right now there is an issue with the DualEnroll withdraw workflow. DualEnroll Support is actively working to resolve it and get a fix pushed out before the April 25 Spring Semester withdraw deadline.

In the meantime, if you have any students who are withdrawing from a Spring Semester course, please follow these steps to process a withdraw:

- Instruct the student email their high school counselor indicating which class they wish to withdraw from.
- The counselor will forward the email from the student to Katy Riebold at <a href="mailto:kriebold@uidaho.edu">kriebold@uidaho.edu</a> indicating their approval or denial of the request.
- Katy will work with the Registrar's Office to manually process any approved withdrawals prior to the deadline.

The Dual Credit Office will keep you posted on updates as they come through. Thank you for your understanding!

### **BE SURE TO KEEP YOUR ACCOUNT ACTIVE**

All U of I accounts are inactivated if no activity is recorded within 180 days, regardless of employment status. All teaching partners are expected to log in to MyUI at the beginning of each term and prior to posted drop and withdraw deadlines to verify roster accuracy and to monitor Vandal email regularly for communication from the Dual Credit Program.

If your account is inactive, you will not be able to check rosters, enter overrides or grades, or check email; it is important that you log in to ensure an active account to avoid registration delays. If your account has been inactivated, you must contact the Office of Information Technology to request reactivation.



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
### ADDING CARDS TO MYUI DASHBOARD


The *My Classes* card has links to your rosters "Class List" and the "Registration Override" menu.

# **Four-Digit Course Numbers**

The University of Idaho will be transitioning to four-digit course numbers for Fall Semester 2025. Zeros will be added to the end of most UI courses (e.g. PSYC 215 = 2150, PSYC 325 = 3250), except for state standard numbered general education classes which will have the first digit repeated (e.g. PSYC 101 = 1101, COMM 101 = 1101).

### CALL FOR BOOK CHAPTERS ON RHETORICAL LISTENING

Have you ever chosen to self-censor when difficult topics arise in your high school or college classroom? Have your students chosen to remain silent? Co-editors Jessica Rivera-Mueller (Utah State University) and Krista Ratcliffe (Arizona State University) are calling for proposals for chapters in their new title *Teaching and Learning with Rhetorical Listening:*Alternatives to Self-Censorship and Silence in High School and College Classrooms.

From the Call for Proposal: "We invite teachers as well as teams of educators, administrators, and/or students to write about ways of incorporating rhetorical listening into their teaching and/or learning. Rhetorical listening is a theory and set of pedagogical tactics that encourage teachers and students to hear – and negotiate – multiple perspectives on difficult topics (1999, 2006, 2022). For this collection, we are interested in what worked when using rhetorical listening as well as what did not and, just as importantly, what was (or could be) done differently."

Chapter proposals are due May 1, 2025.
