### **Employment**

F-1 students may work on campus for up to 20 hours per week during the academic calendar, and then fultime during the academic breaks. J-1 students may also work on campus up to 20 hours per week and full-time during the academic breaks but must report their employment to their International Student Advisor before employment begins.

**Do not** engage in any off-campus employment unless you have received prior authorization from International Services. More information about employment can be found on the IPO website or contact mailto:ipo@uidaho.edu.

#### **Beware of Fraudulent Jobs**

When looking for a job, it is important to be aware that not all job offers are legitimate. What may seem like the perfect job opportunity may actually be a scam trying to use your personal information for identity theft or to get money from you.

Red flags to remember when searching for a job:

- It requires you to provide your credit card/bank account numbers or other personal financial documentation.
- It requires you to pay money upfront for the application.
- You are asked to provide your social security and driver license information in the initial applicationpersonal information should not be given during the initial application process.
- The offer promises a large amount of money for very little work, or focuses solely on the salary and not on the actual job description.
- The employer contacts you via phone, but gives you no way to call them back or the interview is conducted virtually via text or chat and a job offer is given immediately.
- When meeting with an employer it should always be in a public place, i.e., their office, a coffee shop, etc. and not at their home.

When looking at job opportunities, ask yourself:

- Research the company thoroughly: Are they a legitimate business?
  - o Does their website match the job description?
  - Are there any spelling or grammatical errors on the website or in the job listing?
  - o Are there any reports of the company being a scam online?
- Verify contact information: Is the contact information for the company credible?
  - Do they provide you with a way to contact them, and is that contact information correct?
     Often scammers will change one word or letter of a real company's email address, so examine their information carefully.

If you have any questions about a job offering or are unsure if an offer is credible, university resources such as <u>Career Services</u> can assist you.

# **International Travel Requests**

- Ensure all your documents are updated (valid passport, F-1 visa).
- Request a <u>Travel Signature Request</u> in iVandal.
- Be aware of potential delays for reentry if you need visa renewal.
- On OPT? You need your Employment Authorization Document (EAD) card and job offer letter or proof of employment if employed.
