10 CAA Students Participate in London/United Kingdom Architecture Summer Study Abroad Program

Over the summer, ten students (7 based in Moscow and 3 in Boise) from the <u>Architecture</u> and <u>Interior Architecture & Design</u> programs participated in the London/United Kingdom Architecture Summer Study Abroad Program. The students called King's Cross neighborhood their home for 4 weeks.

Led by Boise-based <u>College of Art and Architecture</u> Associate Professor <u>Carolina Manrique Hoyos</u>, students engaged in interdisciplinary research activities understanding multi-layered sustainable and regenerative approaches in the continuous transformation of London and four cities in England (Bath, Oxford, Cambridge and York). Scheduled visits included iconic heritage buildings such as St. Paul's Cathedral and the Oxford University Museum of Natural History, renowned architecture and engineering firms and award-winning contemporary buildings and sites.

Presentation topics during visits included innovative efforts in sustainability and regenerative design, approaches to urban renewal and adaptive reuse, façade engineering, and architectural design for extreme climates. The capstone project was a design charette drawing on research done during the required preparatory seminar (spring) and coursework while abroad during the summer for an alternative (Green) Serpentine Pavilion. The United Kingdom architecture program was created by Distinguished Professor Emeritus <u>Bruce Haglund</u> in 2006 and has been happening since then every other year during the summer.
