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## UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO BOISE UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS ADVISING SHEET TRACK: Years 1&2 BOISE

\*\* Students can use the consortium agreement to take these courses at Boise State University, the College of Western Idaho and other regional institutions. Tuition will be supplemented by the University of Idaho financial aid package

Students complete their final years of undergraduate coursework on the university's main campus in Moscow. Architecture and Landscape Architecture students are strongly encouraged to pursue their professional degrees through the Master's of Architecture or Master's of Landscape Architecture program either in Boise or Moscow

The B.S.Arch degree requires a minimum of 120 credits – at least 3 credits of 200-level or above courses taken outside the disciplines of Architecture, Art, Landscape Architecture, Interior Architecture & Design or Virtual Technology & Design; at least 3 credits of 200-level or above courses taken within the disciplines; and 3 credits of 200-level or above courses in any discipline. (Credits earned in completion of an academic minor may be substituted of elective credits.)

The M.Arch degree requires a minimum of 45 credits. 24 of these credits must be at the 500-level; others may be from 400-level courses in Architecture and 300- or 400-level courses in supporting areas. Arch 552 may be substituted for Arch 554 with permission.

The B.S.E.D. degree requires a minimum of 121 credits and offers a seamless, accelerated path to an accredited professional Master's of Landscape Architecture. The M.L.A. requires an additional 30 credits of coursework at the 500 level.
