Language for 4-year bachelor's degree in catalog

Proposed Updated Language for bachelor's degree or equivalent

Have earned a bachelor's degree from a U.S. college or university accredited by a regional accrediting body or from a recognized international institution. The bachelor's degree should involve four years of study, equivalent to 120 semester credit hours or 180 quarter hours.

Students who satisfy all criteria listed below will be considered for graduate admission to the University of Idaho:

Have a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited U.S. college or university or recognized international institution. If the degree is not from a regionally accredited institution, the application may be reviewed by the department and by the College of Graduate Studies.

Or

Have completed three years of undergraduate study in an international accredited institution which has a Memorandum of Understanding in place with the University of Idaho for a cooperative 3+2 program leading to a graduate degree. Cooperative 3+2 programs may have higher entrance requirements (see <u>COGS</u> website for a list of 3+2 programs).
