A budget presentation and open forum will be held March 27, at 3:30 pm in the Clearwater/Whitewater rooms in the ISUB (location tentative) to obtain university feedback on our proposal.

Attached please find a schedule of proposed changes for FY2026. These changes reflect fee increases needed to support an anticipated \$1.55 per hour change in employee compensation (CEC) for fee-funded units. The proposed tuition increase, estimated to generate an additional \$3.5M in tuition revenue, is needed to fund the portion of the \$1.55 per hour CEC for general education-funded positions not covered by state general funds as well as a portion of the impact of inflation. Adjustments to tuition and/or fee increases may be necessary should state CEC funding or other assumptions change. A final determination on tuition and fees will be made by the Regents of the University of Idaho in April.
