Keeping Youth and Animals Healthy During Hot Days

July is here and the heat is turning up! We hear the most incidents

- of animals becoming ill and dying during July. With fair at the end
- of the month, the pressure is on to be prepared. During this busy
- 4 time, don't forget to take care of yourself, youth, and your animals.
 - Here are some tips for surviving the hot weather.

Working with Animals:

- Provide access to clean water at all times
- Provide shelter or shade
- Work your animals during the cooler morning and late evening hours
- Give animals space to spread out to increase air movement
- Avoid hauling animals when possible

For People (modified from <u>University of Kansas Health System</u>):

- Wear light-colored, loose fitting clothing
- Wear sunscreen
- Drink water
- Take frequent water breaks
- Rest indoors during the hottest parts of the day
- Keep reusable water bottles clean

Remember to take care of yourself and your animals, as well as reminding others.

EXHIBITOR ADMISSION LIVESTOCK

Each livestock exhibitor that submits entries into the Fair will receive two (2) admission wristbands. Admission wristbands are good for admission each day of the Fair. **Wristbands will be packaged per exhibitor** and will be available to pick up in the Livestock Show Office (downstairs, Fair Building) beginning **Monday, July 8**.

4-H VOLUNTEER ADMISSION

4-H Volunteers of livestock exhibitors entered into the Fair may purchase an admission wristband for \$15.00, good for admission each day of the Fair. Admission wristbands may be purchased online www.canyoncountyfair.org or in the Livestock Show Office (downstairs, Fair Building). Admission wristbands must be purchased prior to the Fair opening (July 25). After the Fair starts, 4-H Volunteers will be required to pay full price at the gate (\$8 daily).

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR PARENT/GUARDIAN ADMISSION

Parents and guardians of livestock exhibitors entered into the Fair may purchase an admission wristband for \$15.00, good for admission each day of the Fair. Admission wristbands may be purchased online www.canyoncountyfair.org or in the Livestock Show Office (downstairs, Fair Building). Admission wristbands must be purchased prior to the Fair opening (July 25). After the Fair starts, parents and guardians will be required to pay full price at the gate (\$8 daily).

FCS FAIR ADMISSION

4-H members who are **ONLY** exhibiting in 4-H Family & Consumer Sciences (FCS) will receive two (2) admission tickets. Admission tickets are good for admission one (1) day of the Fair. (4-H members who are exhibiting livestock *AND* FCS will receive two (2) admission wristbands, good for each day of the Fair.) 4-H members who are **ONLY** exhibiting in FCS will receive their admission tickets when they deliver their exhibits to O'Connor Field House on Monday, July 22 from 3:00 - 7:00 p.m.

TO PURCHASE ADMISSION WRISTBANDS

Visit the Livestock Show Office or www.canyoncountyfair.org between June 18 - July 24. Wristbands will be available to pick-up beginning July 8 - July 24. One Fair opens on Thursday, July 25, wristbands purchased online must be picked up at Gate 1.

REMINDERS

- Each livestock exhibitor will receive two (2) admission wristbands. Please plan accordingly when purchasing additional wristbands.
- Exhibitor wristband packets will be available to pick up beginning July 8.
- Additional wristbands must be purchased and picked up by 8:00 p.m. on July 24.
- Fair Office hours are Monday Friday, 8:00 a.m. 4:30 p.m. Fair week office hours are 8:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m.
- Wristbands will not be mailed.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR WRISTBANDS

- Wristbands are NOT required to be worn until July 25.
- It is important that the wristbands are fastened snug enough so they cannot slip off the wrist.
- If a wristband is broken, please bring to the Livestock Show Office to be exchanged.
- Lost wristbands will not be replaced.


