2024 Canyon County Fair Market Tag and Declaration Information

In 2024, all market species and horses will complete declarations through an online process. Please note that the declaration process is separate from your fair entry. Declaration due dates are scheduled by species and listed below. Declarations are not required for breeding animals and small animals.

Prior to tags being available participants will need to be enrolled in correct market project in Zsuite.

Members will need to reserve tags by midnight the night before at <u>canyoncountyfair.org</u>. Tags should be placed in the animals left ear (when you stand over the animal).
