### **Selecting a 4-H Project**

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Whether this is your first year in 4-H or not, the start of the new 4-H year is an opportunity to try something new or expand on interests that you already have. With around 160 4-H projects in Idaho, there are lots to choose from! So how do you choose?

Pro-Tip #1: Decide how many projects you can reasonably complete in a year. It can be hard to choose just a few projects, but we recommend no more than 2 projects for a 1st year 4-H member. For returning 4-H members, think through all of your extra-curricular, school, and other obligations to assess how much time you have.

Don't forget to give yourself enough time to complete an oral presentation, record book, and public exhibit per project.

**Pro-Tip #2:** When narrowing down your list, stop and think about what really gets you excited to learn. Was there an interesting disease that you heard about in your swine project last year and now you want to try Veterinary Science? Have you been inspired to draw more and want to try an art project? Are fall holidays making you wish you could sew your own costume? Did you dabble in archery during a day camp and now want to dive in? Listen to your gut when you are selecting projects. If you are really interested in learning a topic, take it as a project. Not sure if it is a project? **Pro-Tip #3:** Chat with your 4-H leader. Now is a great time to check in with your 4-H leader about trying a new project. Make sure that it is something your club can support or see if there is an upcoming STEP (Short-Term Enrollment Project) or another club you can take the project with. There are lots of ways to make a new project work, but you have to talk to your leader about what you want to learn. Also, everything will go much smoother during your year if you talk it through before just diving in.



**Pro-Tip #4:** Start a new project with the right attitude and goal to learn in mind. The main goal of any project is to learn more about the subject. Don't get caught up in worrying about how you will do at fair or in any other competition. If you do your best and learn something new, you really are doing great in a new project. If you have questions about projects, don't hesitate to contact the Extension Office. We are happy to help you. If you stop by the office, you can take a look at the wide array of curriculum we have in our curriculum cabinets before you decide.

#### **Club Financial Summaries & Audits**



At the conclusion of each 4-H year, all 4-H clubs and entities are required to submit a financial summary and financial audit to the Extension Office.

These are *due by November 1*. Please read and follow the audit guidelines carefully. Clubs may lose their 4-H status if they fail to submit these forms in a timely manner.

As a reminder, members will not be able to order project materials or re-enroll until their club's financial summary and audit are turned in to the Extension Office. You can find this report on the State 4-H website under club documents or click the link: State 4-H Website.

### **ZSuite Enrollment**

As of October 1, all 4-H enrollment will be rolled over to an inactive status. Zsuites is open for Members and volunteers to begin re-enrolling at 4h.zsuite.org.



Once a member has completed the online enrolled AND paid their member fees (\$25/member or \$32/horse member) they will be made active. Remember to select **ALL PROJECTS** you will be participating in when enrolling.

Volunteers are required to complete "University of Idaho Protecting Minors" and their public records review with Sterling Volunteers every 3 years. If you are unsure when those expire feel free to reach out to the Canyon County Extension Office at 208-459-6003.

#### **Club Fair Packets**


Club Fair Packets are ready for pick up at the Canyon County Extension Office. You will need to fill out the Club Update Form prior to receiving your Club's packet.


