Master Gardener's Recommend . . .

Tartarian Maple | *Acer tataricum* Wide range, small tree or large shrub

Saskatoon Serviceberry | *Amelancher alnifolia* Native, well-drained

Pagoda Dogwood | Cornus alternifolia Moist, well drained, shady, fruit, colorful flowers

Eastern Wahoo | *Euonymus atropurpureus* Adapted to harsh contitions, red flowers, fall color

Sargeant Crabapple | *Malus sargenti* Spring flowering, fall fruit.

Washington Hawthorne | Crataegus phaenopyrum Tolerates compacted soil, fall colors, berries

Japanese Tree Lilac | Syringa reticulata Adapts to various soil conditions

Arborvitae | *Thuja occidentalis* Windbreak, soft greens, conifer, a variety of sizes

Nannyberry Vibernum | Vibernum lentago Wide soil conditions

Mugo Pine | *Pinus mugo* Moist well drained soils, dwarf tree
