

Articulation agreement between North Idaho College and University of Idaho, including a vision for the early pathway for Law School at University of Idaho (<https://www.uidaho.edu/law/law-prospective/3-and-3>)

Follow the proposed timeline below for completion of this plan

***Years 1 and 2 at North Idaho College***

- Follow a NIC and U of I Philosophy pathway to earn your Associates of Arts in Philosophy degree at NIC
  - Complete all suggested courses listed on that pathway to fulfill requirements

***Year 2 at North Idaho College***

- In the late fall or Early Spring
  - Apply to University of Idaho (rolling admissions, no hard deadline)
- In the Spring (after application for admission to U of I)
  - Submit University of Idaho Law School registration form by May 15<sup>th</sup>\*
  - Sign up for Fall LSAT – note score release date
- In the Summer
  - Study for LSAT

***Years 3 and 4 (1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> years at University of Idaho)***

- Follow a NIC and U of I Philosophy pathway to earn your Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science in Philosophy at U of I
  - Complete all courses and requirements as required by the major
  - Work closely with your advisor, the department, and the U of I College of Law to coordinate your entrance into the 3+3 program
  - Take first year Law courses to fulfill the 20 credit of related fields requirements

***Year 3 (1<sup>st</sup> year at University of Idaho)***

- In the Fall
  - Take the LSAT
  - Start your application to the college of law; submit it by January 15<sup>th</sup> with your LSAT score

***Year 4 (2<sup>nd</sup> year at University of Idaho)***

- Take 30 credits from the Law School
  - Work with the College of Law, your department, and your advisor so these will satisfy the 20 related fields credits requirement for your Philosophy B.S./B.A.
